March 13, 2015

Well, it's Friday the 13th. Becca, btw, isn't worried about it. Becca, if you are not familiar with my dogs, is my mini Australian Shepherd. She worries about a lot of things. Worrying occupies most of her waking hours. But she's not worried about Friday the 13th. Mainly because she can't count that high.

The superstition began either in the Middle Ages or sometime later or maybe earlier. I'll get to that in a minute. 
















March Classes & Special Events
