#### **December 16, 2016**

I've decided to create a Christmas wish list that will never be filled. They make movies about stuff like this. It usually ends well with the listed getting, if not exactly what she wants, something a lot better. I don't expect anything from my list except having a little fun.

1. I want a pair of pjs worn by Joan Watson on the tv show Elementary. She wore them once. She came down the stairs at the beginning of the show wearing the coolest black & white horse pjs. Later in the show, Sherlock wakes her up (a different day) and she has on different pjs. I don't know how may sets of pjs this character owns, but you rarely see her in the same outfit twice, pjs or otherwise. I looked them up, foolishly thinking that might be something I could get for myself. Silly me. They are made by Olivia von Halle, and they cost about \$500. If I owned \$500 pjs, they'd be the only pair in my drawer.

Now I realize that this is to and she is just a character, but she is one of the best dressed characters on to, although she clearly doesn't generate the income to support her clothing habit, especially a different pj a night kind of life style. I know, I know. It's to. And it's marketing. And it doesn't have to be realistic. But it would have been nice to see those pjs one more time in that one episode.

2. Also on my list is an unusual yarn that comes from the muskox. The yarn, called qiviut which is an Eskimo word that means down or underwool, is made from the fine undercoat of the muskox. It's one of the warmest & most luxurious fibers in the world. It can be washed, it's light weight, and it holds its warmth even when wet. But it's not an easy yarn to come by. Domestication of the muskox began in the 1930s, I think. Then a Musk Ox Producers' Cooperative was formed in the late 1960s by Native women on Nunivak Island. The women make knitted items for sale and for a long time, I think, the only way to get any product, let alone the yarn itself, was to buy from the coop. I'd love something from the coop but that stuff is pricier than the horse pjs.

Today, the yarn is available through limited sources-which actually isn't the difficult part of the Christmas wish list item. It's the cost. One ounce (think head band, maybe a hat?) runs about \$110. I like scarves. That would take 6-7 ounces, is my thinking. And while I'd love to do a poncho/wrap out of the stuff, I can't see wearing a \$1,000 poncho any more than I can envision wearing \$500 pjs.

Now Becca heard me talking about my Christmas list and she decided she wanted in on the action. She's convinced me that she and Cassidy need a human sized walk in dog house that is solar heated.

"You mean a greenhouse?" I asked her.

"No, a dog house with solar panels. If you want to grow tomatoes in it, that's up to you."

She's being thoughtful here-if I can walk into it, then I can also store stuff in it, like dog food, extra blankets, wood shavings, buckets, plastic swimming pool, etc. But it could have a human door and a dog door and it would provide some shelter during cold days. "It's on the list."



Misty Pond-paper piecing class Nov. 3 & 17, Dec. 1 1-4 or 6-9 \$25 Sue Frerich

Misty Pond is one of Judy Niemeyer's patterns. You can choose this pattern or any of the other Judy Niemeyer's patterns.
